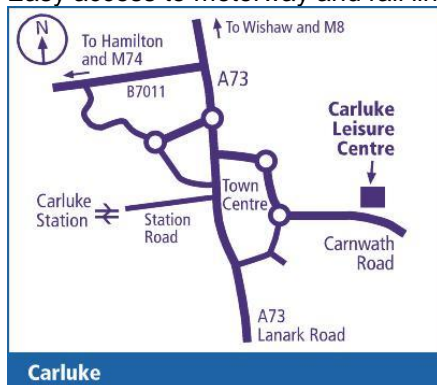


CARLUKE LEISURE CENTRE:

ELIGIBILITY: Last qualifying date is 25th August 2018

(all qualifications gained up to and including this date count toward eligibility for this competition)

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **Judges:** Rachel Bradley, Sarah Holroyd, Claire Price, Helen Conacher & Susie Galloway. Reserve judges will be appointed as necessary.
2. The show has been kindly sponsored by Fish 4 Dogs and Feelwells.
3. Entry costs £6 per dog, per class.
4. Qualifying Certificates will be given for all scores of 175 or higher in Levels 1-4 and 180 or higher in Levels 5-6. Rosettes and prize cards will be awarded for 1st – 6th places.
5. **Booking In:** Competitors should personally register at the Show Secretary's desk on arrival and collect their competition ring numbers. Competitors are responsible for ensuring they are ready to enter the ring when their running order is called.
6. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
7. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden.
8. The committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their full details recorded on the entry form. Dogs that have not been registered as Not for Competition cannot be allowed to enter the competition premises.
10. In the event that the competition is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the competition, but in any event the club will refund fees within 3 months of the competition date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within one month of the competition date.
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfil their appointment; the organiser reserves the right to appoint an alternative judge.
12. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
13. Should circumstances so dictate the organiser, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes will be reported to the Kennel Club.
14. Only dogs of six calendar months of age and over on the day of the competition are eligible to take part in Level 1 and 2 classes. Only dogs of 12 calendar months of age and over on the first day of the competition are eligible to take part in Level 3 or higher classes or special classes which incorporate jumps or similar exercises.
15. A dog must not be entered or compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
16. Entry passes to the show are not required.
17. **No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of any dog at any time within the precincts of the competition.**
18. No competitor shall impugn the decisions of the Judge or Judges. Judges' discretion prevails and Judges' decisions are final.
19. After a dog has commenced competing in a Class, no substitution of Handler is permitted in that class.
20. For the duration of the competition, all dogs must be on a lead except when competing. Please respect dogs competing in the ring and keep a decent distance.
21. Food or toys shall not be carried in the ring or given to a dog whilst under test.
22. The attention of competitors is drawn specifically to the Kennel Club Rally Competition Regulations 9, 17 & 19.
23. Once a dog has entered the ring to compete, no further practice may be carried out.
24. A dog must, at the time of entry for the competition, be registered as required by Kennel Club Rules and Regulations in the owner's name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of joint registered owners, the full name of every registered owner must be given. Where an owner makes an entry on behalf of another joint registered owner(s) or where an agent enters on behalf of a single or joint registered owner(s) such person must have the authority and consent from the single or joint registered owner(s) to sign the entry form on their behalf, thereby binding them all to Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. In the event of any dispute, evidence of such authority and consent will be required. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form (and in accordance with the conditions set out above).
25. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by a scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family or resident at the same address as a scheduled judge. Following discussion between the Chief Steward and the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Competition if it is - a. A bitch which is in season; b. Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease; c. Interfering with the safety or change of winning of an opponent; d. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal or e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing. The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club.

27. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT OR COLD DAYS:** Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in low or high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

28. Welfare of Dogs: A competitor whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not knowingly put their dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

29. No modifications may be made to the Schedule once published except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club which must be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press if possible.

30. Animals in Event: No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of a competition during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the host organisation, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the competition, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.

ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

LEVELS

Rally handler/dog teams compete in their lowest eligible class from Level 1 to Level 6. They may also compete at the subsequent level. Progression to the next Level does not require either wins or places. Progression is dependent upon gaining 3 Excellent scores, under 3 different judges, or 6 qualifying scores under four different judges.

Levels 1-4 have a qualifying score of 175. Levels 5-6 have a qualifying score of 180.

Scores equivalent to these qualifying scores (or greater) earned at Limited Rally Competitions do not count towards Progression, Rally Level Titles or Excellent Titles.

In all levels a qualifying score of 190 or above equates to an excellent score.

ELIGIBILITY

When entered for a competition, a dog must be entered in a standard class at the level for which it is eligible, plus two further classes, one of which may be at the subsequent higher level. A dog can be entered in special class(es) only. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes. Special classes do not count for progression.

Level 1 – Open to dogs which have not achieved a Level 1 or Level 1 Excellent Title.

Level 2 – Open to all dogs which have achieved a Level 1 or Level 1 Excellent Title, except those that have achieved a Level 2 or Level 2 Excellent Title. Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 1 may also enter at this Level.

Level 3 – Open to all dogs which have achieved a Level 2 or Level 2 Excellent Title, except those that have achieved a Level 3 or Level 3 Excellent Title. Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 2 may also enter at this Level.

Level 4 – Open to all dogs which have achieved a Level 3 or Level 3 Excellent Title, except those that have achieved a Level 4 or Level 4 Excellent Title. Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 3 may also enter at this Level.

Level 5 – Open to all dogs which have achieved a Level 4 or Level 4 Excellent Title, except those that have achieved a Level 5 or Level 5 Excellent Title. Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 4 may also enter at this Level.

Level 6 – Open to all dogs which have achieved a Level 5 or Level 5 Excellent Title. Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 5 may also enter at this Level.

*** All level titles gained up to 31-12-17 still move the team up to the next level. From 01-01-18, the new regulations apply. Where a dog has partially completed a title at a level, the qualifying certificates already achieved at that level will still count towards progression out of that level.
