SHOW REGULATIONS & RULES

These rules and regulations are to be read in conjunction with the Kennel Club Obedience Show Regulations G under which this show is licensed. It is the responsibility of everyone entering this show to make themselves familiar with the Kennel Club G Regulations, available from the Kennel Club.

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Obedience Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. Only dogs of six calendar months of age or over on the first day of the Show are eligible for competition at Kennel Club registered Obedience Shows.
4. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their full details recorded on the entry form.
5. Online entries can be submitted with www.withyourdog.co.uk
6. Running orders will be available online at ObedienceUK.com and will be sent by email to relevant competitors unless the competitor has stated that they wish to receive their running order by post.
7. The committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. In the unlikely event of the cancellation of the show for any reason beyond the control of the Show Society, entry fees less any costs incurred in staging the show will only be refunded upon written request. The amount refunded shall be the total entry fee less the cost of any direct and fixed overheads, charges or the like that the Show Society is liable to pay, being deducted proportionately based upon the total entry. The Show Society will use its best endeavours to mitigate any charges and costs incurred. All claims for refund must be made within fourteen days of the date of the show, and refunds will be made within one calendar month of the claim.
9. In classes without a full running order dogs will be received until one hour after the commencement of judging (**10.30am**) after which no dogs may be received except under unforeseen and exceptional circumstances and by special permission of the Show Management.
10. Timed stays will take place and will take priority over other tests; the times will be published at the show and in the catalogue.
11. For the duration of the show all dogs, including those in the exercise area, must be on a lead except when competing or practising prior to competition.
12. Animals allowed in Event. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
13. Following discussion between the Chief Steward & the show management, a dog shall be disqualified and removed from the Show if it is: (a) A bitch which is in season. (b). Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease. (c). Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent. (d). Of such temperament or so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal. (e). Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
14. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
15. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
16. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
17. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
18. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
19. No prize money is on offer. Rosettes and prize cards to sixth place.
20. **DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS. Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperature and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.**
21. Welfare of Dogs. A competitor whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
22. In the event of any cheque or money order not being honoured when first presented to the Bank, the exhibitor shall be held liable for any Bank charges, costs or fees incurred. If the entry fee and such charges are not paid immediately upon request the exhibitor will be reported to the Kennel Club and will be dealt with by the Kennel Club Committee.
23. The Club will not be held responsible for any loss or damage arising from any cause whatsoever.
24. Passes will not be sent. Any exhibitors requiring confirmation of receipt of entry must enclose a S.A.E.
25. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) within the licensed venue and within the environs of the Show, including car and caravan parks and approaches.
26. The Show Society cannot guarantee any requests for specific judges or class parts; they shall be carried out in accordance with KC Regulations.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

1. In the following Definitions of Classes First Prize wins in Limited Show Obedience Classes and Open Shows confined to one breed do not count for entry in Open and Championship Show Obedience Classes but do count for eligibility at Limited Obedience Shows or Open Shows confined to one breed.
2. A dog not qualified to enter Championship Class C must be entered in the lowest scheduled class for which it is eligible and may also be entered in Championship Class C and these dogs may also enter Open Class C and/or one additional class if scheduled. (Note the qualification for Championship Class C and Obedience Warrant).
Exemptions from this regulation are:-
3. Societies may schedule classes other than those defined below. The eligibility for "Special" classes must be defined by the Society and included in the schedule. The word "Special" must be included in the title of the class.

PRE-BEGINNERS: To compete in Pre-Beginners a handler or dog must not have won a total of two or more First Prizes in Beginners Class or one First in any other Obedience Class, (Pre-Beginners excepted).

BEGINNERS: To compete in Beginners a handler or dog must not have won a total of two or more First Prizes in Beginners Class, or one First Prize in any other Obedience Class, (Pre-Beginners excepted).

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won, two First Prizes in Obedience Classes. (Pre-Beginners and Beginners excepted).

CLASS A: For dogs which have not won, three First Prizes in Class A, B and Open Class C in total.

CLASS B: For dogs which have not won, three first prizes in Class B and Open class C in total.

OPEN CLASS C: At Open Shows, and in the Open C Classes held at Championship shows, open to all dogs.

SPECIAL PRE-BEGINNERS – Exhibits must have obtained a minimum of their Kennel Club Good Citizen Dog Scheme Bronze Award prior to the closing date of the show. A handler, or dog, must not have won a First Prize in Pre-Beginners, nor gained a third place or above in any other standard obedience class.

DIRECTIONS

Exit M5 at J21. Follow A370 towards Bristol. Passing through the villages of Hewish, Congresbury and Cleeve until you reach Backwell. At the traffic lights turn left towards Nailsea. Take the first turn right. The show will be signposted.
