ENTRIES:

PLEASE NOTE THAT **SOME LEVELS ARE CAPPED TO 40 ENTRIES (LEVELS 1, 2, (BOTH PARTS - A & B) AND 3 & 4)**. WHEN THAT NUMBER HAS BEEN REACHED AT EACH RESPECTIVE LEVEL (OR PART OF LEVEL), BOTH ONLINE AND POSTAL ENTRIES WILL BE CLOSED. POSTAL ENTRY COMPETITORS WILL BE CONTACTED VIA EMAIL. ONLINE ENTRANTS MAY BE INFORMED OF ANY ARRANGEMENTS FOR A RESERVE LIST. IN THE CASE THAT ENTRY CANNOT BE ACCEPTED, A;; ENTRY FEES WILL BE REIMBURSED..

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Judges as listed. Reserve judges will be appointed as necessary.
2. Entry fees are £6 per dog, per class.
3. Rosettes and place cards will be awarded to 5th place in all classes. Qualifying certificates will also be awarded to all competitors gaining a qualification (a score of 180 or above) at this show. There will be NO prize money on offer at this show.
4. The Show will open at 8am and the morning competitors should **book in at the Show Secretary's Table on arrival**. The first **walk-throughs will be scheduled 30 minutes prior to judging commencing in that ring**. See your running order sheet for judging times in each level. Once booked in, please **add your name to the order of running sheet at the steward's table by each ring FOR EACH LEVEL YOU HAVE ENTERED**. Walkthrough for L1.PtA and Level 2.PtA and Level 3 is at 8.30am. Walkthrough for Level 4 and Level 6 is 9am. In the afternoon, walkthrough for L1.PtB and L2.PtB is 12.30pm. Walkthrough for L5 is 1pm.
5. No bitches in season can compete.
6. The mating of bitches with the precincts of the competition is forbidden.
7. The committee reserves the right to refuse entries.
8. 'Not for Competition' entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Details of each dog must be recorded on the entry form and must be KC registered. FREE TO ALL.
9. In the event that the competition is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the Association will refund fees. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the way in which they entered the competition, but in any event, the Association will return fees within 3 months of the competition date to all those who had entered and **requested a refund within 1 month of the competition date**.
10. Should a judge be unable to fulfil their appointment, the organiser reserves the right to appoint an alternative judge. Reserve Judges will be appointed for each level.
11. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
12. Should circumstances so dictate, the organiser, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes will be reported to the Kennel Club.
13. Only dogs of six calendar months of age and over on the day of the show are eligible to take part in Level 1 and Level 2 classes. Only dogs of 12 calendar months of age and over on the day of the show are eligible to take part in Level 3 or higher classes, or special classes which incorporate jumps or similar exercises.
14. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including a special class.
15. Under Regulation S(B)3.d., competitors should book in at the Show Secretary's table; once they have their ring number, they should sign in at the Steward's table at each ring for the level (s) in which they are entered. NB: Class allocations and timings will be sent to all competitors by email a week before the show (**or by post, only if the competitor encloses a SAE**).
16. No entry passes are required for competitors or officials.
17. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of any dog at any time within the precincts of the competition.
18. No competitor shall impugn the decisions of the Judge or Judges.
19. After a dog has commenced competing in a class, no substitution of handler is permitted in that class.
20. For the duration of the competition and including those in the exercise area, all dogs must be on a lead, except when required within the confines of the ring(s).

21. Food or toys shall not be carried in the ring, or given to a dog whilst under test. **Please ensure you have left toys and food outside the ring (not in your pocket) before you enter.**
22. The attention of competitors is drawn specifically to the KC Rally Competition Regulations 9, 17 and 19.
23. A dog cannot be entered in the same class more than once.
24. **Once a dog has entered the ring to compete, no further practice may be carried out.**
25. **Dogs must enter and leave the ring on a lead.**
26. A dog must, at the time of entry for the competition, be registered as required by Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the owner's name or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of joint registered owners, the full name of every registered owner must be given. Where an owner makes an entry on behalf of another joint registered owner(s) or where an agent enters on behalf of a single or joint registered owner(s), such person must have the authority and consent from the single or joint registered owner (s) to sign the entry form on their behalf thereby binding them all to KC Rules & Regulations. In the event of any dispute, evidence of such authority and consent will be required.

A dog acquired after entry having been made at a competition may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the KC before the competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and Conditions of the original entry form (and in accordance with the conditions set out above).
27. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by a scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as a scheduled judge.
28. Following discussion between the Chief Steward and the show management and /or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the competition if it is :-
 - a/ A bitch which is in season
 - b/ suffering from any infectious or contagious disease
 - c/ interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent. Please be respectful.
 - d/ of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal
 - e/ likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing. The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the show incident book and submitted to the KC.
29. Judges' discretion prevails and Judges' decisions are final.

29. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

30. WELFARE OF DOGS

An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a KC licenced event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

31. No modifications may be made to the Schedule once published, except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which must be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press if possible.

32. ANIMALS AT THE EVENT

No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of a competition during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the host organisation, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the competition, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will always be kept under proper contr
